don't know whether we'll get paid for actually doing the shows."

Duke commented that after graduation they were uncertain as to whether or not they would stay together as a singing group. "Judy Winters is going to Ohio Wesleyan University and I'm going to Ashland. The rest are in college right now."

Recently, the New Folk appeared on the Vivienne television show April 25, and next month they are attending the Columbus Youth for Decency Rally at Mershon Auditorium. Possible engagements in the near future include the Fifty-Fifty Club, and the Bistro.
